1. Applying for a Place at UWA

Complete a School of Music application form and return it to the Administrative Assistant by Friday 25 September 2009. Please note that any applications received after 25 September will incur a late fee. Post your completed School of Music application form (and composition portfolio where applicable) to:

All applicants must apply, online, through TISC (www.tisc.edu.au). You will be offered the highest preference for which you are eligible. You should order your preferences according to the course you would most like to study.

2. Audition

Auditions for 2010 entry will take place between 19 October – 1 November 2009.

Please see checklist below which outlines what you need to prepare and bring to your audition.

3. Notification & Offers

You will receive a letter from the School of Music regarding your audition notifying you of your success or otherwise. However, an indication of success in the audition does not constitute an offer of admission or guarantee a place in 2010. Offers for places in UWA Music courses are determined considering both TER scores and audition results. The School of Music needs to wait until all tertiary entrance exam results have been made available before determining its first year intake for 2010.

First round offers for TISC applicants for 2010 university admission, including UWA Music, will be available from 20 January 2010. Second rounds offers will be available from 3 February 2010. You are able to change preferences up to 11.00pm on Thursday 7 January 2010 for the main round of offers and up to 11pm Monday 25 January for the second round. The UWA Admissions Centre (Phone: 6488 2477) will be open most days over the Christmas/New Year period to offer advice if you need it.

Candidates are required to perform two pieces of contrasting style, tempo and technical requirements. |

Candidates are required to bring an example of work in music notation (e.g. a composition, arrangement or exercise). ** |

Candidates are required to provide at audition an example of written work preferably related to music (e.g. an essay, program note or project).** |

Applicants are encouraged to demonstrate keyboard ability at audition at whatever level they are capable (e.g. perform a short piece in any form, genre or style). |

Composers will have posted a portfolio in advance. An interview with the Coordinator Applied Music (Composition) will occur directly after audition. |

Music Education students to complete, and bring to audition, the questionnaire which will be attached to your audition date and time letter. |
